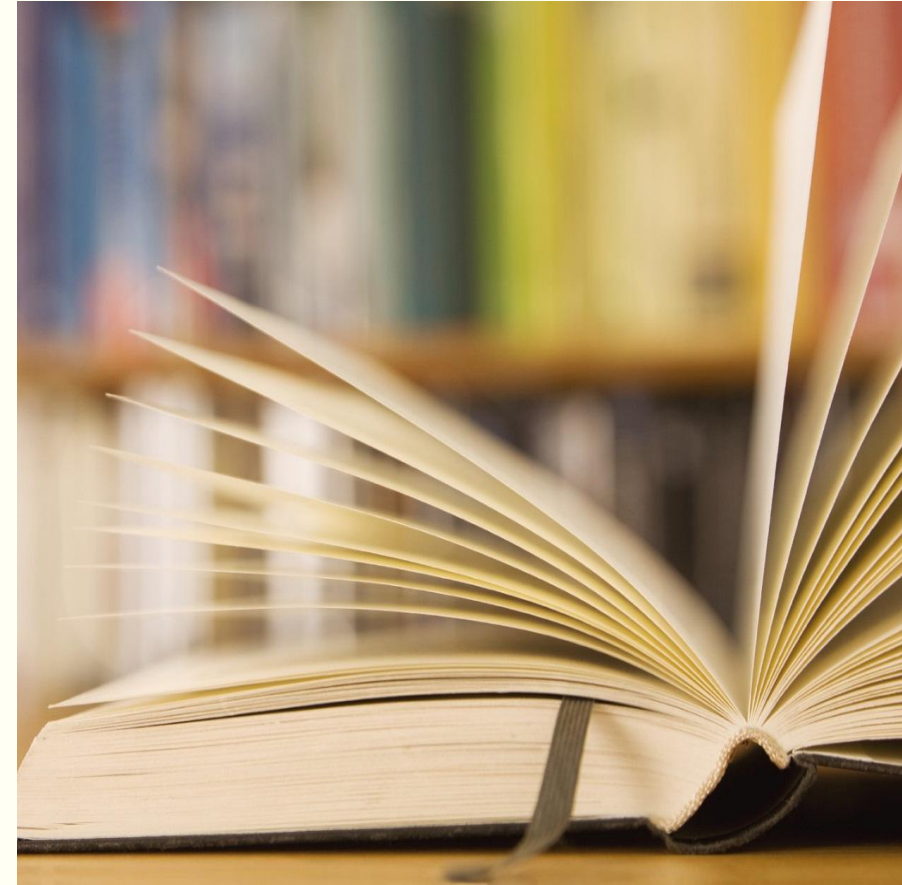

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

ADVANCED STUDIES DIPLOMA

Required credits

- 4 - English
- 4 - Social Studies
- 4 - Math
- 4 - Science
- 2 - Health & PE (students must complete hands-on training in First Aid/CPR/AED)
- 1 - Economics and Personal Finance
- 3 - World Language: 3 credits in one language **OR** 2 credits in each of 2 different languages (4 credits total: e.g., French 1 & 2 plus Spanish 1 & 2)
- 4 - Electives □ *2 sequential; **One must be a Fine/Performing Arts or CTE Elective**
- ***Students must complete an AP, Honors, IB, or Dual Enrollment course OR earn a CTE Industry Credential or Certification, OR complete a high-quality work-based learning experience, as established by Board guidance on work-based learning.***

AP CLASSES

Advanced Placement classes: college-level coursework, college preparatory courses

Program of classes to provide students an introduction to college-level classes and to have the ability to gain college credit

End-of-course exam score of 3+ required for college credit

Earning college credits alongside the diploma can lead to tuition savings as an undergraduate student



DUAL-ENROLLMENT CLASSES

Classes are taken at the high school through a cooperative agreement between PVCC and FCHS; student is an enrolled college student

Students accrue both college and high school credits that count toward graduation (grade of at least C required for PVCC credit).

Credits for most classes transfer to other post-secondary institutions, including four-year universities both in Virginia and out-of-state

Individual Course Request Meetings
